

EMPTY (BIRD) NEST EXPLORATION WALK Ware River Watershed "Prison Camp" Area Rutland Sunday January 17th 10 a.m. – 1 p.m.

Join us for a winter walk during which we'll keep a look out for last year's bird nests and try to identify the former occupants. The ramble will be along wide, mostly-flat dirt roads through mixed habitats. We'll also keep an eye out for winter birds and mammal tracks and sign. The roadways provide ample room for physical distancing, and we'll follow the masking protocol. Bring binoculars, cameras, snacks, and beverages if you wish. Number of participants will be limited.

The Great Backyard Bird Count (GBBC) is a free, fun, and easy event that engages bird watchers of all ages in counting birds to create a real-time snapshot of bird populations. Participants are asked to count birds for as little as 15 minutes (or as long as they wish) on one or more days of the four-day event and report their sightings online at **birdcount.org**. Anyone can take part in the Great Backyard Bird Count, from beginning bird watchers to experts, and you can participate from your backyard, or with a Ware River Nature Club group exploring a defined area with a team traveling in separate

vehicles. Stay tuned for Club plans for this event.
